PERU - Earthquake

- A 7M earthquake, at a depth of 40km, hit ca. 25km off the coast of the department of Arequipa, on 25 September, 16h42 UTC. 14 000 people were exposed to "Strong" shaking. No significant tsunami threat by this earthquake; JRC calculations indicate a max. wave height of the order of 0.1m.
- As of 26 September: 16 people injured, 68 houses uninhabitable, over 450 buildings damaged, power and water supply affected; Caraveli province worst affected.

PAKISTAN - Earthquake

- A 7.7M earthquake, at a depth of 10km, hit the district of Awaran, in Balochistan province, on 24 September 2013.
 Worst affected were the districts of Turbat (Kech), Panjgur, Chagi, Khuzdar, Gwadar and Awaran.
- As of 25 September, 328 people were reported dead and 498 injured, with a tentative figure of 21 000 families affected.

INDIA - Severe Weather

 Heavy rainfall and ensuing floods have affected Gujarat state (ca. 400mm of rain in 24h in Rajkot city over 25 September).
 40 000 people in the southern parts of the state have been evacuated.

PHILIPPINES - Severe Weather (SW Monsoon)

 As of 26 September, NDRRMC reports 430 563 people affected by the Southwest Monsoon in Central and Southern Luzon and Visayas. Out of this number, 106 939 have been displaced and 20 753 are in 101 evacuation centers, while 30 have been reported dead (29 in Zambales, one in Bataan). (ECHO)

THAILAND - Floods


 As of 26 September, ca. 2.1 million people in 191 districts have been affected by floods, with ca. 6 900 houses and 183 400ha of farmland were damaged by the floodwater and nine people have been killed. (ECHO)

CAMBODIA - Floods

 More rain is expected in the coming days and the current level of Mekong and other rivers indicate risk of worsening of the situation.
 (ECHO)

LAO - Floods

 Water level of rivers is dropping in Champasak, Saravan, Xe Kong and Attapeu provinces; some sections of Mekong and Xe Don rivers still exceed flood risk levels. The Meteorology and Hydrology Department warns of more rain next week over central and southern parts of the country. (ECHO)
