



SITUATION

- Typhoon SOUDELOR** made landfall in **Hualien** county (Taiwan, late 7 August) and **Fujian** province (south-eastern mainland China, 8 August UTC), affecting the areas along its path with heavy rainfall, strong winds and storm surge.
- As of 9 August, local authorities in **Taiwan** report **seven** people **killed** and five missing in New Taipei City, Pingtung and Yilan counties. As of 9 August, 11 800 people were evacuated in 17 counties, mostly in Hualien (3 064), Kaohsiung (2 297), New Taipei (1 686), Yilan (796) and Pingtung (707), while over 400 people were injured. Local media report over **90 000 people** remaining **without electricity** as of 10 August, although 95% of the initial damage to power supply that affected approximately 4.3 million people has already been restored.
- After the landfall in Fujian, it moved north-northwest weakening and dissipating, but still causing heavy rains, floods and landslides in several areas. As of 9 August, there were reports of casualties and damage in **Fujian, Zhejiang, Anhui** and **Jiangxi** provinces, with over **21 people** killed and five still missing, more than 3 200 houses collapsed and 48 000 were damaged.
- Heavy rainfall is forecast to continue affecting eastern mainland China over the next 24h, including northern Zhejiang, and a Yellow Warning is in effect by the Chinese Meteorological Administration as of 10 August morning.
